About Our Speaker:

Eric Buckland graduated from the University of Kansas with a Bachelor's degree in English and a commission as a Second Lieutenant. He spent 22 years in active duty in Special Operations. Eric was involved in engagements in Panama, Honduras, and El Salvador. He believes his military activities provided him a unique understanding of Mosby's Rangers. Eric Buckland retired as a Lt. Colonel in 1999. Mr. Buckland received a prestigious award, the United Daughters of the Confederacy Jefferson Davis Historical Gold Medal on June 6, 2011 for his work on the 3rd Arkansas Infantry reflected in Mosby's Keydet Rangers and editing The Millionaire Mosby Ranger, Charles Broadway Rouss. He subsequently received a second Jefferson Davis historical Medal for his series on Mosby's Men on October 03, 2013.




The author at John Singleton Mosby's gravesite in Warrenton VA holding a pistol once used by Mosby, himself.



2019 List of Donations for Preservation by Jim Duffy

With the VERY successful conclusion of the 2018 – 2019 Campaign Season, it has been determined that the following Civil War Battlefields will receive a donation from this organization in the amount of \$5000.00. There are matching funds with each bequest and will be listed below:

\$1000.00 for preservation of 42 acres at Stone's River (TN) – matching funds of \$33.94 for a total of \$33940.00

\$1000.00 for preservation of 15 acres at Fort Donelson, Chattanooga and Franklin – matching funds of \$21.17 for a total of \$21170.00.

\$1000.00 for preservation of 185 acres at Wilderness, Cold Harbor and Bentonville – matching funds of \$10.43 for a total of \$10430.00

\$1000.00 for preservation to the Shenandoah Battlefields Foundation of 35 acres at New Market Battlefield – matching funds of \$14.00 for a total of \$14000.00

\$500.00 for preservation of 226 acres at Reams Station, Petersburg Breakthrough, Champion Hill and Jackson Battlefields – matching funds of \$7.48 for a total of \$3740.00

\$500.00 for preservation of 73 acres at Shiloh and South Mountain Battlefields – matching funds of \$6.89 for a total of \$3445.

As a result of donations and funds given to this organization, the \$5000.00 to be donated to the above will be matched for a total of \$86,725.00 for battlefield preservation.






