Our 43rd Campaign Year!

From the Brigade Commander

On behalf of the Board of the Civil War Round Table of Eastern Pa., Inc., I'd like to apologize for any disappointment you may be feeling about our need to cancel our September—and now, October—Round Table meetings. Although the Commonwealth has loosened some Covid-19 restrictions, guidelines regarding conference room occupancy and public meals are ultimately set by the hotel's management. As a short-term solution, we are amid contacting speakers to learn their willingness/ability to present their lecture topics via Zoom, an internet tool you will find to be very easy to use.

We have finalized the selection process for preservation gifts for our 42nd Campaign Year. Last month, I shared news of a \$500 gift to the GAR Civil War museum in Philadelphia. Another \$1,500 will be sent to the American Battlefield Trust (ABT) to help save a three-acre tract that comprises a portion of West Woods of the Antietam Battlefield—site of some of the heaviest fighting in the entire Civil War, according to the ABT. Our donation will be matched 1:1, which means we will receive credit for \$3,000 of preservation assistance, bringing our total 42nd Campaign Year contribution to \$3,500!

While on the subject of Civil War preservation, I'd like to ask that each of you follow in the footsteps of CWRT member, Ed Root. A few months ago, Ed reached out to Representative Susan Wild to express his concern over proposed legislation regarding the removal of Confederate monuments from our national parks. Our colleague, Wayne Schaeffer, has picked up the baton, as it were, and shared an easy way (see page 2) for how all of us can make a lasting difference. I encourage you all to pitch in and demonstrate to our government representatives that the CWRT of Eastern Pa. is serious about the preservation of Civil War history. Thanks.

Ed and Nancy Root and President and First Lady Trump approach the Flight 93 National Memorial in Shanksville, Pa. to lay a commemorative wreath during the 19th anniversary service dedicated to the 40 victims of Flight 93. Among the victims was Ed's cousin and flight attendant, Lorraine Bay.

In addition to the many contributions he has made to the CWRT of Eastern Pa., Inc., Ed is the vice president and past president of the Families of Flight 93. During his public address at the memorial service, Ed said, "It's always an honor to represent the 40 heroes of Flight 93 and an honor to represent all of the family members of the heroes of Flight 93, as well as the partners of this whole event—the ambassadors, the Park Service people, the Friends of Flight 93."





Honoring Ed Bearss: The Voice of History

The CWRT of Eastern Pa. celebrates the life of Ed Bearss, who died on September 17th at age 97. Bearss began his work life as a member of the Marine Corps, where he served in the Pacific Theater during World War II. After graduating from Indiana University with a M.A. in history, he joined the National Park Service, ultimately rising to the position of chief historian. He authored several books on the Civil War and received many accolades for battlefield interpretation and

preservation. He was among the originators of the modern battlefield preservation movement. His battlefield tours have been described as "legendary."


Your Raffle Dollars and Donations at Work!

Our recent preservation gift of \$1,500 (to be matched 1:1 by a challenge grant) will help save a three-acre tract that comprises a portion of the West Woods. Thanks to you, a piece of our national heritage ... and natural habitats ... will be preserved!

On the morning of September 17, 1862, West Woods was the scene of some of the opening fighting of the Battle of Antietam and some of the heaviest fighting of the entire war. Around 9:30 a.m., part of General Edwin Sumner's Union Second Corps advanced into the West Woods. The combined firepower of Confederate artillery and attacking infantry drove them back. Union General John Sedgwick's division lost more than 2,200 men in less than 30 minutes in ill-fated charges.
