## About Our November Topic....

**October 1864:** The confederate ironclad *Albemarle* had sunk two federal warships and battered seven others, taking control of the Roanoke River in North Carolina and threatening the Union blockade. Twenty-one-year-old Navy lieutenant Will Cushing hatched a daring plan: to attack the fearsome warship with a few dozen men in two small wooden boats.

What followed, the close-range torpedoing of the *Albemarle* and Cushing's harrowing escape from rebel posses, is one of the most dramatic individual exploits in American military history, and the capstone of a career full of adventures.

In Commander Will Cushing, Daredevil Hero of the Civil War, Jamie Malanowski brings to life a compelling and unheralded figure on the 150th anniversary of his greatest feat. Theodore Roosevelt said "(Cushing) comes next to Farragut on the hero roll of American naval history," but few have ever heard of him today. Tossed out of the Naval Academy for "buffoonery," frequently cautioned for headstrong and impetuous behavior, Cushing proved himself a prodigy in behind-the-lines warfare.

"Like many war stories, the tale of the young and rebellious Commander Will Cushing was tucked away into the dusty archives of history. Jamie Malanowski skillfully resurrects Cushing's courageous adventures on the high seas during the Civil War in this action-packed page-turner. Beginning with Cushing's youthful pranks at the U.S. Naval Academy and culminating with his triumphant sinking of the Confederate CSS Albemarle, Commander Will Cushing is a must-read about a daring young soldier whose extraordinary achievements have earned him a place alongside America's most celebrated naval heroes." -- Senator John McCain.

He is the author of *And the War Came*, an account of the six months that led up to the attack on Fort Sumter, and *Commander Will Cushing*, *Daredevil Hero of the Civil War*, as well as two novels. We will be at Nisky Hill Cemetery on Saturday, October 22 at 10am.



My Years as a member of the Civil War Roundtable of Eastern PA

In the early 1970's I noticed a small article in the Morning Call which described a group of individuals who were meeting monthly for the purpose of studying the Civil War and were seeking new members. The

article provided a date, time, and location for the next meeting and after a few weeks I attended my first meeting in the basement of the Brass Rail on Lehigh Street in Allentown. The Brass Rail was to be the meeting place for many meetings thereafter until the membership grew in number and the cigarette smoke became overbearing. The speaker that evening was a gentleman who was not only very knowledgeable, but very entertaining in his approach to his topic. His name was George Seligman, to whom our June meeting is dedicated.

As time went by, I became Adjutant, a position I held for a number of years and during which time I got to know many men who were to become not only speakers, but officers as well. Some of these men authored books on various aspects of the Civil War. As the Roundtable grew, there developed an interest in providing funds for the preservation of battlefields and the maintaining of various monuments along with other Civil War related projects. Funds came from memberships and raffles and over the years have provided a substantial part of the money used to achieve the Roundtable's goals.

Unfortunately, due to a variety of factors, our enrollment has seen a decline and it is up to our present members to do what they can to bring about meaningful change. We need to actively seek out new members young and old to continue our dedication to the study of the Civil War and the important part it played in the growth of our country.
