About Chris Bryce, Chief of Interpretation, Petersburg National Battlefield

Chris Bryce began his National Park Service Career in 1987 as a seasonal park ranger at Manassas National Battlefield Park. He became a permanent employee in 1988 as an interpretive park ranger at Independence National Historical Park.

In 1992 he returned to Manassas NBP serving as an interpretive park ranger. In 1999 he became an interpretive park ranger at Colonial National Historical Park/Yorktown Battlefield. In 2008 he became the supervisory park ranger for the Historic Jamestown unit of Colonial National Historical Park. Where he oversaw the visitor services operations of the site. He is currently the Chief of Interpretation for Petersburg National Battlefield a position he has held since 2010.

Chris holds a Bachelor's degree in History with a concentration in 18th and 19th American military history and 20th century European military history from East Tennessee State University. He resides with his family in Williamsburg, VA.

Chris Bryce's Addresses Grant's Crossing of the James and the Battle for Petersburg." Grant's Crossing of the James and the initial assault against Petersburg June 12-18, 1864

On June 12, 1864, General Ulysses S. Grant, secretly withdrew the Army of the Potomac from its position's in Front of Cold Harbor. From there he and over 100,000 men of the army would embark on one of the more impressive turning movements of the war. Two days later after some

hard marching and superb logistical work, the Federals began crossing the James River. Once across the river Grant set his sights on the vital transportation hub of Petersburg. Defended by roughly 4,600 Confederate troops under the Command of General P.G.T. Beauregard, could Petersburg hold out until reinforcements arrived from General Robert E. Lee who was in the dark about the whereabouts of Grant's army.





Kudos to Wayne Schaeffer for locating a gem of an activity. At a recent visit to Gettysburg, Wayne gained permission to see Neill (Lost) Ave. It is the only avenue in the park that has not been paved and it is on private property. It is the place where the 2nd VA. Infantry fought Neill's Brigade at the extreme right end of the union line. Wesley Culp was in the 2nd VA. Infantry which adds an additional interest to this portion of the battlefield. The owner and guide, Dean Schultz suggested a start time of 9:30 because he has in mind to do a personal tour in two segments; The first takes about 2 1/2 hours and includes starting at his barn, the overall big picture for this end of the battle, Neill Ave and possibly McAllister's Mill. The second portion would continue on to the Z. Taney farm and Spangler's Spring which will be a total time of about 4 hours. If someone decides to leave after the first portion they may go back to their car and leave prior to the second portion beginning.

We are planning on leaving from the Holiday Inn at Fogelsville at 7 am on October 28, 2017 and car pooling as we ususally do. If you could contact Wayne, Barry, or myself at any one of the e mail addresses below and just let us know you plan on attending. We are including the parking directions in the event that you prefer to meet us there. It would still be nice to know if you are coming so we can keep an eye out and try to not get started until everyone is there. Please feel free to bring a friend or two. We are asking a \$5.00 donation per person to present to Mr. Schultz for his favorite preservation endeavor.





A Woman's Place...Is in the War Taken from Wikipedia

Mary Edwards Walker (November 26, 1832 – February 21, 1919) was an American abolitionist, prohibitionist, prisoner of war and surgeon. As of 2017, she is the only woman ever to receive the Medal of Honor. In 1855, she earned her medical degree at Syracuse Medical College in New York, married and started a medical practice. She volunteered with the Union Army at the outbreak of the American Civil War and served as a surgeon at a temporary hospital in Washington, DC, even though at the time women and sectarian physicians were considered unfit for the Union Army Examining Board. She was captured by Confederate forces [2] after crossing enemy lines to treat wounded civilians and arrested as a spy. She was sent as a prisoner of war to Richmond, Virginia, until released in a prisoner exchange. After the war, she was approved for the highest United States Armed Forces decoration for bravery, the Medal of Honor, for her efforts during the Civil War. She is the only woman to receive the medal and one of only eight civilians to receive it. Her name was deleted from the Army Medal of Honor Roll in 1917 (along with over 900 others); however it was restored in 1977. After the war, she was a writer and lecturer supporting the women's movement until her death in 1919.
