# Reflecting On Karl Lehr, A Legacy of Honor, Commitment, and Generosity



Karl Lehr was truly a renaissance man. He was a teacher, veteran of World War II, a preservationist and a philanthropist. During his time as a member of our Round Table he served our organization in many capacities. His commitment to historic preservation was accomplished through voice, labor and monetary contributions. Karl led a full life and his passing in 2009 at the age of 93 years generated a final gift that will continue to benefit future generations of our great land. A combination of his bequest to our Round Table and matching grants from leading Civil War preservation organizations brought \$463,000 to the cause of historic preservation in 2011. We honor Karl's memory tonight at our "Karl Lehr Memorial Dinner."

#### **About Our September Speakers....**

James Hessler has been a Licensed Battlefield Guide at Gettysburg National Military Park since 2003.

His book Sickles at Gettysburg (Savas Beatie, 2009) was awarded the R.E. Lee Civil War Round Table's "Bachelder Coddington Award" and the Gettysburg Civil War Round Table's "Distinguished Book Award" as the most outstanding work on the Gettysburg Campaign.

His latest book, Pickett's Charge at Gettysburg, was co-authored with Wayne Motts and was released in July 2015. It has been received very favorably by both readers and critics alike as the first battlefield guide ever published on the famous July 3 assault.

Jim has been a guest on Travel Channel, NPR, PCN-TV, Breitbart News, Civil War Radio, and Gettysburg Daily. He was one of the primary content designers for the Civil War Trust's mobile Gettysburg application and animated maps. Jim has written several articles for Gettysburg Magazine and other national publications He is a frequent speaker at Civil War Round Tables and has taught courses for the Gettysburg Foundation and Harrisburg (PA) Area Community College.

**Wayne E. Motts** is the Chief Executive Officer of The National Civil War Museum, one of the largest museums in the country dedicated to the study, interpretation, preservation and exhibition of the American Civil War.

His professional resume is an impressive list of nationally recognized organizations. Wayne has served as the Chief Executive Officer of the Adams County Historical Society, the Curator of the Cumberland County Historical Society, and Senior Research Historian for the TravelBrains Corporation. Wayne has been a Licensed Battlefield Guide at the Gettysburg National Military Park since 1988. In 2013, Wayne received the Emeritus Guide designation for more than twenty-five years of service, and as such was one of the youngest guides to be so recognized with that honor.

Wayne received his Bachelor of Arts with a Major in Military History from The Ohio State University. He received his Masters of Arts in American History from Shippensburg University of Pennsylvania.

Wayne is an accomplished author, publishing books and articles about the war including "Trust in God and Fear Nothing, General Lewis A. Armistead," and (with James Hessler) "Pickett's Charge at Gettysburg; A Guide to the Most Famous Attack in American History." Wayne can be seen on numerous television documentaries and videos produced by the History Channel, the TNT network, and the A&E channel.

An accomplished speaker, he has given hundreds of presentations about the war in 20 different states to a wide range of groups, historical bodies, and organizations including the Smithsonian Institution in D.C.

# **Donations for Battlefield Preservations – 2015 – 2016 Campaign Season**

## James Duffy

On behalf of the members of the CWRT of Eastern PA, Inc., the following funds were donated for the preservation of Civil War battlefield sites with the purpose of the continuing education of the American public and the honoring of those who gave their lives for the preservation of this nation:

- \$1500 to the Civil War Trust toward the purchase of 202 acres at Appomattox Court House. With the matching funds offered, this amount converts to \$16000.00 toward the preservation of this land.
- \$500 to the Central Virginia Battlefield Trust toward the purchase of 1 acre on the eastern edge of "Tapp Field" opposite to the famous "Lee to the Rear" cry by Confederate soldiers from Texas Brigade during the fight in the Wilderness in 1864.
- \$102 to the Civil War Trust for the purchase of land at the Perryville KY battlefield. This amount was raised at the April 5<sup>th</sup> meeting of the CWRT of Eastern PA from donations by members present and an anonymous matching donation.
- \$135 to the Civil War Trust for the purchase of land on the Union left at the Battle of Fredericksburg. Again, this amount was raised at the February 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting of the CWRT of Eastern PA from donations by members present and an anonymous matching donation.

The Board of the CWRT of Eastern PA thanks everyone who contributed toward this successful campaign and urges all to continue this Roundtable's tradition of battlefield preservation during the upcoming 2016- 2017 campaign season.

# **Summer Ramblings by Ed Root**




Where did you travel this summer? On July 29, my wife and I headed north to visit the Revolutionary War Battlefield of Saratoga in upstate New York. Not far south of the battlefield is the small town of Mechanicville where in the Hudson View Cemetery lies Elmer Ellsworth, first martyr of the Union. I'm sure the story of the 24 year old Colonel Ellsworth is known to most all students of the Civil War. He was shot at point blank range on May 24, 1861 by James Jackson, owner of the Marshall House in Alexandria as he walked down the stairs after taking a large Confederate Flag down from the roof of that building. Jackson was immediately killed by one of Ellsworth's men. That banner had been viewed from Washington and after Virginians approved succession Union troops landed in Alexandria. A grieving Abraham Lincoln, personal friend of the young man since before leaving Springfield, ordered his body to be brought to the East Room of the White House. Ellsworth was born in Malta, NY and buried in the town where he grew up. His death touched and angered many in the North and became a

rallying cry. Jackson became a martyr for many in the South. The dying and the suffering and crying had just begun. See 1861 The Civil War Awakening by Adam Goodheart for an excellent account.

This is the same GAR Post for which there is a monument in Bethlehem's Rose Garden that is currently undergoing restoration.

As you can see in the accompananying photograph the cannon is in need of a fresh coat of paint. The folks at the Cemetery will be power washing the cannon and granite base in September and our organization has volunteered to paint the cannon. We will also be doing research on the men buried around the cannon. Some of the tombstones are quite worn and can be read only with difficulty if at all. We hope to honor these soldiers who helped save the Union by sprucing up their final resting place as well as documenting their lives so they can be viewed as humans and patriots and not just pieces of faded stone.
