Hello:

I am pleased to be elected Brigade Commander for the coming year. A bit about me. I am retired from the National Park Service where I served for 38 years. I was Superintendent of El Morro National Monument in New Mexico, Lincoln Boyhood National Memorial in Indiana, Morristown National Historical Park in New Jersey, Valley Forge National Park in Pennsylvania, as well as several other parks.

My specific interest in the Civil War came when I came into possession of a diary that my Great Grandfather wrote during and after the war. He was an Indiana farm boy who signed on to the 36th Indiana Volunteer Infantry from Henry County, Indiana.

His journal tells of his trials and tribulations and successes from enlistment until the time he was badly wounded the day before his unit was a part of the assault on Kennesaw Mountain near Atlanta. I have visited several of the places he mentioned in his journal.

As we begin another year, let us remember the work and sacrifice that the soldiers on both sides went through. There are several excellent programs. I am sure you will enjoy the fellowship this year.

Remembering Karl Lehr, A legacy of honor, commitment and generosity



Karl Lehr was truly a renaissance man. He was a teacher, veteran of World War II, a preservationist and a philanthropist. During his time as a member of our Round Table he served our organization in many capacities. His commitment to historic preservation was accomplished through voice, labor and monetary contributions. Karl led a full life and his passing in 2009 at the age of 93 years generated a final gift that will continue to benefit future generations of our great land. A combination of his bequest to our Round Table and matching grants from leading Civil War preservation organizations brought \$463,000 to the cause of historic preservation in 2011. We honor Karl's memory tonight at our "Karl Lehr Memorial Dinner."

ABOUT OUR SEPTEMBER PROGRAM'S SPEAKER, CRAIG L. SYMONDS AND HIS LATEST BOOK, OPERATION NEPTUNE: THE ALLIED INVASION OF EUROPE AND THE D-DAY LANDINGS

Just over seventy years ago, the lead elements of an Allied army that would eventually number more than two million landed on five beaches on the Normandy coast in German-occupied France. It was the biggest amphibious operation in history and marked the beginning of the end Of the Nazi Empire. This talk will discuss the planning, the strategic arguments, the logistical difficulties, the training, and finally the cross-Channel assault that made the invasion possible. While the story of D-Day is often told starting on the morning of June 6, 1944, this talk will provide the back story to that operation and focus especially on the Navy's role.

ABOUT CRAIG L. SYMONDS

Dr. Craig L. Symonds is Professor of History Emeritus at the United States Naval Academy. The first person to win both the Naval Academy's "Excellence in Teaching" award (1988) and its "Excellence in Research" award (1998), he also served as History Department chair from 1988 to 1992, and received the Department of the Navy's Superior Civilian Service medal three times. He was Professor of Strategy at the U.S. Naval War College in Newport, Rhode Island (1971-74) and at the Britannia Royal Naval College in Dartmouth, England (1994-95). After retirement in 2005, he returned to the Naval Academy for one year in 2011-12 to serve as "The Class of 1957 Distinguished Professor of American Naval History."

Dr. Symonds is the author or editor of twenty-six books, including prize-winning biographies of Joseph E. Johnston (1992), Patrick Cleburne (1997), and Franklin Buchanan (1999), as well as *The American Heritage History of the Battle of Gettysburg* (2001). *Decision at Sea: Five Naval Battles that Shaped American History*, (2005) won the Theodore and Franklin D. Roosevelt Prize for Naval History. His 2008 book, *Lincoln and His Admirals: Abraham Lincoln, the U.S. Navy, and the Civil War*, won the Barondess Prize, the Laney Prize, the Lyman Prize, the Lincoln Prize, and the Abraham Lincoln Institute Book Award. He also won the Nevins-Freeman Prize in 2009. His book on the Battle of Midway was published in 2011. His newest book is *NEPTUNE: The Allied Invasion of Europe and the D-Day Landings*, released in May 2014.

He and his wife Marylou live in Annapolis, Maryland; they have one son and two grandchildren.
