

### **Exclusive Field Trips**

The CWRT of Eastern Pa. sponsors field trips for members and their guests to places few people ever see. These private tours are conducted by someone who is expert on the topic or location:

**January**, **2019**: A behind-the-scenes tour of some of the thousands of holdings in the National Civil War Museum's archives, conducted by historian, author and museum CEO Wayne Motts.

October, 2018: A walking tour of a portion of the Antietam National Battlefield with Dennis Frye (historian and author), who has dedicated years of his life to the study of the Civil War, especially the Battle of Antietam and Harper's Ferry.

October, 2017: Tour of private, ancestral land surrounding "Lost Avenue" (in Gettysburg National Military Park) by historian (and land owner) Dean Shultz. The tour included stops at several other historic sites as well the chance to witness rarely seen views of Spangler's Spring and Spangler's Meadow.
